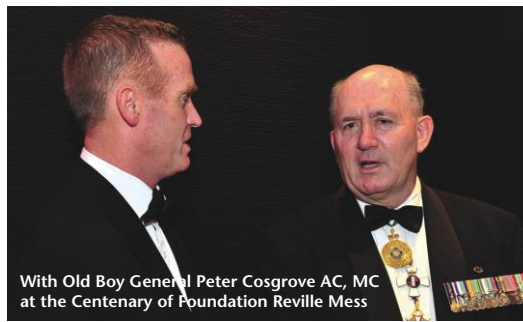


Centenary of Foundation

At the end of last year a colleague, Dane Inman and I headed off to Kolkata. The trip was a reconnaissance mission. We were to visit projects that Waverley College might consider helping through fund-raising. The possibility of future immersions for students was also discussed. I had been to Kolkata before but Dane had not. He was immediately caught off-guard by the noise, pollution and the sheer busyness of the city. Twenty two million people inhabit the city during business hours! We visited the city garbage dump which is home to 5000 people. The people survive by picking through the garbage and selling what they can. There is one water pump and no toilets. We were both traumatized at what we saw. We hope to help build a school and clinic here.

We were very fortunate to visit Arunachal Pradesh on the Tibetan border. The Christian Brothers have a school here which Waverley helped fund. The plight of women in this very isolated community is heart breaking. Girls as young as 10 years old are



traded for livestock. Polygamy is common as is domestic violence. The Brothers, through education, are helping to change entrenched sexist attitudes. One young brother runs a Women's Empowerment Group. I was invited along to a meeting. Enough to say that I'll never complain about my life again!!

Our travel guide, Br Ralph, exposed us to lots of projects that the Brothers have set up. Edmund Rice would be so proud of these men who literally dedicate their lives to making a difference to the most materially poor people on the planet.

The hospitality we received from the Brothers everywhere we went was just wonderful. They also counselled us and put things in perspective at the end of another harrowing day. The trip was exhausting, both physically and emotionally. It has certainly 'disturbed' me but that was its purpose....

80% of results for exams complete were in the Band 4, 5 or 6 categories (a mark of 70 or higher).

The Waverley College Higher School Certificate class of 2010 has achieved excellent results across a range of subjects.

I congratulate the Year 12 students of 2010, as well as their families and teachers, on these very good results.

School Certificate 2010

Waverley College has achieved School Certificate results above the state average in all six examinations.

Highlights of the School Certificate Results

96% of students received Band 4 or above in the English Literacy Examination.

92% of students received Band 4 or above in the Science examination.

81% of students received Band 4 or above in the Australian Geography, Civics and Citizenship examination compared with 59% across the state.

In the Computer Skills Examination 71% of students scored Highly Competent, compared to 55% across the state.

From these results we look forward with confidence that students have established a firm foundation for their studies as they begin the final two years of their secondary education.

On Thursday 2nd December 2010, 36 students, two parents and six staff members departed on Air Canada flight AC 33 bound for Vancouver, British Columbia, Canada. Our 14 hour flight went smoothly, with everyone enjoying the individual touch screens and the multiple movies available.

We arrived to a chilly 3°C winter day and were greeted by our host and coach driver, Ron. Ron took us across the Canada/USA border crossing, towards our first few nights in Clackamas, Oregon. Our 10 hour coach trip took us through British Columbia, Washington State and into Oregon State. Here we stayed at the Sunnyside Motel located near the Clackamas Town Centre.

Our first games of basketball were against Centennial High School; a 5A ranking school. Here we had the opportunity to stretch our legs and put into practice all our hard work from training. Unfortunately, all teams suffered significant losses, to a school that competes in 66 different sports.

From Vancouver we travelled to Pemberton Secondary School, north of Whistler. This town was nestled in a valley surrounded by large snow covered mountains. Again the whole school packed into the gymnasium to watch the Junior Varsity team secure victory. All Waverley teams registered success against Pemberton.

KEVIN RICE (OAM)

1932 - 2011

Extracts from SMH 13.1.11

Kevin Rice was more than just a great architect. His horizons extended beyond mere buildings - however expertly and inventively designed - to conservation and commercial harmony.

The legacy of his career in Sydney, which began when he returned from London in 1960, was a city with buildings the likes of the HSBC Tower (previously Coopers & Lybrand) in George Street and the Zenith Centre in Chatswood, and others such as the Queen Victorian Building, restored from a dilapidated state to become heritage gems. Other major projects include the Sacred Heart Hospice in Darlinghurst and Liverpool Hospital.

Kevin James Rice was born in Waverley on June 8, 1932, the only child of a commercial artist, Henry Rice, and a society seamstress, Mercia (Merle, nee Shea). Rice attended Waverley College and then enrolled at the University of NSW to study architecture. In 1955, he was one of the university's first architecture graduates, with honours, then went to work as an architect in England and Norway. He married an English woman, Teresa (Terry) Turner-Nash, in London.

In his semi-retirement, Rice was still busy. He was retained by the NSW Supreme Court as a referee and expert in property and construction matters, and by the NSW Department of Fair Trading, in 2005, in a review of licensing in the NSW Home Building Industry. He negotiated the provisions of the NSW Architects Act on behalf of the profession, and presided over disciplinary hearings at the Architects Registration Board. In recent years he was a member of the Heritage Council and the boards of St Vincent's Hospital and Waverley College (*he was still a Board member and contributed to many alterations to the College buildings and surrounds*).

In 2004 he was awarded a Medal of the Order of Australia (OAM) for his service to architecture.

Kevin Rice is survived by Jillian, his sons Simon, Dominic, Crispin and Jeremy, stepchildren Campbell and Justine, and 12 grandchildren.



JOHN AUSTIN CHAPMAN (AM)

26/8/1928 - 5/10/10

It was with much regret that the OBU was advised of the passing of John Chapman on the 5th October last year. John was a former President of the OBU (1965-67)

John, son of Major General John Chapman (also an ex Waverley student) attended the college and subsequently graduated from Duntroon. John army saw service in Japan and Korea and retired from the army in 1954. His father's ceremonial sword was presented to the Waverley College Cadet Unit to be carried by the senior cadet on all ceremonial parades and the Chapman baton is presented annually to the outstanding cadet. John then devoted his time to sports administration, in the fields of swimming, athletics, rugby, cricket and tennis.

He was awarded the Member of the Order of Australia (OAM) in 1979, for service to the community and in 2004, was appointed a Member of the Order of Australia (AM) for service to cricket administration. He also received the Federal Ministerial Sports Encouragement Award, Australian Sports Medal, and was Senior Vice President, Cricket NSW, Secretary Waverley Cricket Club, International Rugby Timekeeper Junior Wallabies, Davis Cup Administrator, President of the NSW Schoolboy's Cricket Association. John also founded the Waverley College Rugby Union Referees Association, the first Australian School to do so. John also worked as Business Manager of Sancta Sophia College at the Uni of Sydney and with his very good mate Phil O'Sullivan was instrumental in organising the Waverley Cricket Club/China Friendship Cricket tour in 1988.

To John's wife Shirley, son's Christopher and Austin (also old boys) and their families the OBU extends its deepest sympathy.

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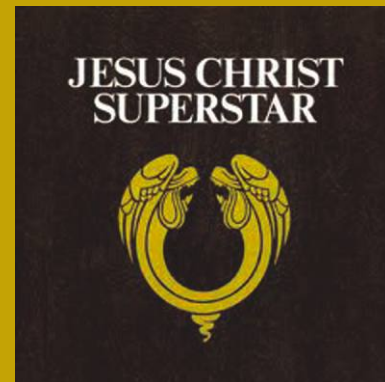


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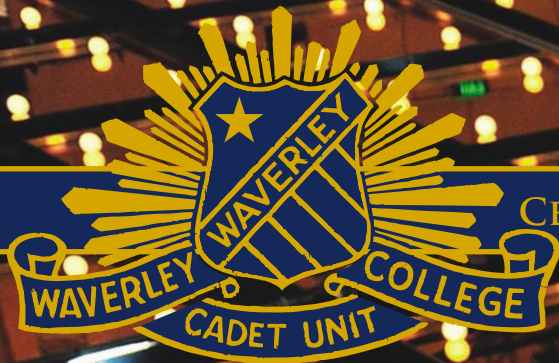
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CENTENARY OF FOUNDATION REVEILLE MESS

In 1985 the Waverley College Cadet Unit held the first Reveille Mess Dinner. This event was designed to mark the start of cadet training for the year, hence the title "Reveille", named after the bugle call for the start of the day.

The dinner brings together the newly appointed senior ranks of the Unit (Year 12 boys who are Cadet Under Officers or Cadet Warrant Officers) and their fathers, together with Old Boys of Waverley College who served in the senior ranks of the Cadet Unit.

As part of the Cadet Unit's Centenary of Foundation events the dinner of 2011 was attended by 350 guests at the The Sofitel Sydney Wentworth Hotel. Amongst these was the Unit's Guest of Honour, General Peter Cosgrove (Ret'd), AC, MC, former Chief of Defence. General Cosgrove delivered the Reveille Toast, which followed Toasts to the Australian Army Cadet Corps and the Waverley College Cadet Unit. Following General Cosgrove's address, the current OC of the Unit, LTCOL (AAC) Peter Frost, a College contemporary of General Cosgrove, carried out the "Roll Call", assisted by the Unit RSM, Cadet Warrant Officer Francis O'Neill. The roll call covered a remarkable span of the ages with former senior ranks represented from 1947 through to 2010. Some Cadet Old Boys had travelled from Europe and Asia to be present on this occasion. Souvenir "regimental" ties and Unit cuff links were available for purchase on the night, and all guests received a souvenir lapel badge featuring the Unit crest.

Other notable guests on the occasion included the Headmaster of the College, Mr. Ray Paxton, The Hon. Mr. Justice Barry O'Keefe, AM (Ret) and Brother Paul Oakley, representing the Christian Brothers and former Headmasters of Waverley College, whose support for the Unit was so influential in the continuation of the Cadet Unit.

Current NCOs in the Unit wore historical uniforms from the Unit's history and a continuous slide show on a plasma television provided many guests with some poignant memories from their past in the Unit.

Later in the year, on 18th September, the Unit will hold its annual Ceremonial Parade. On this occasion the Unit will receive a new set of flags, donated by the Old Boys Union

OLD BOYS SOCIAL JUSTICE

In October 2010 two old boys, John Darvill and Matt Leo, both from the class of 2002 travelled to the PNG highlands to support the Sisters of Mercy to establish a maternal health clinic in the village of Pundibassa.



The sisters, through their development agency 'Mercy Works Inc.' have been active in the region supporting the local bishop and clergy to improve the lives of the people. Pundibassa, five hours over rough roads from the regional centre of Goroka lacks even the most basic health service. With support from Mercy Works the local bishop had acquired a kit home to serve as the basis of a new clinic. Although labour was plentiful the bishop and the sisters were worried that local workers lacked the skill and expertise to complete the job.

Becoming aware of the sisters concerns former teacher and old boy Michael Elphick, a member of Mercy Works Inc, suggested approaching the Old Boys. John and Matt, both qualified builders, made themselves available for two weeks, enough to see the job all but completed. As is usual in such projects the Old Boys consider they gained much more from the experience than they gave – grateful locals might disagree.



A second project is in under consideration, this time a tuberculosis centre in Timor Leste. A shared project of Rotary International and Mercy Works, Old Boys are again negotiating to send a team of tradesmen to help with the build.
